## Meeting summary Wednesday 27 November 2019

#### **Greater Christchurch Partnership Committee**

The Greater Christchurch Partnership is a voluntary coalition of local government, iwi, health and government agencies working collaboratively for the prosperity of Greater Christchurch.

The Greater Christchurch Partnership Committee leads and coordinates the work of the Partnership.

One of the key functions of the Committee is to establish an agreed strategic framework to manage growth, and address urban development, regeneration, resilience and wellbeing matters for Greater Christchurch.

On significant matters the Committee seeks ratification from each of the individual partner governance meetings.

The Greater Christchurch Partnership Committee:

- Noted the <u>GCP Committee Memorandum of Agreement</u> remains in place until such time as the Committee seeks to amend it and agreed that the Memorandum of Agreement will come for consideration to the Committee's April meeting.
- Elected Mayor Dan Gordon as the Deputy Chairperson of the Greater Christchurch Partnership Committee.
- Received the <u>Greater Christchurch Partnership</u> <u>Committee overview document</u> and summaries on Waka Toa Ora, Canterbury Wellbeing Index, and Health in All Policies.
- Received the <u>Urban Development and Regeneration</u> <u>Update</u> annual summary for 2019 which provides a summary of our partners' work in 2019 towards the achievement of our Urban Development Strategy goals.
- Adopted the Committee meeting dates for 2020.
- Received a <u>presentation on the Greater Christchurch</u> <u>Strategic Framework</u>. The framework will enable:
  - *Strong, consistent position* of Greater Christchurch with central government, private sector, people
  - Stronger partnership and shared purpose

- Coordinated focus on improving wellbeing.

- 1. Identify the opportunities and challenges facing Grater Christchurch
- 2. Articulate the opportunity of Greater Christchurch in a national and international context
